Today's anthem: In the 20th century, there was an effort to preserve spirituals as part of serious choral repertoire. Arrangers such as William L. Dawson in his Tuskegee Choir Series published many spirituals, including today's anthem, a fast and rhythmic folksong of the African American tradition. **Offertory anthem:** Anne Krentz Organ serves as the Director of Music Ministries at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Park Ridge, IL. The anthem text is adapted from the Lutheran Book of Worship (1978). She uses the short repeated "Holy, Holy" passage as a unifying motive throughout. **Communion anthem:** Of the original chant, probably written in France during the 10th century author unknown, only three verses are now used. We have added random bells today. In preparation for communion, the rite known as the Mandatum from the first word of the introit (Mandatum novum do vobis... "A new Commandment I give unto you, that you love one another, as I have loved you" is Christ's final lesson in charity, humility and friendship.

In April we achieved a positive balance for the month and we have a positive balance for the year. We are up to date on our apportionments to the Virginia UMC. One of the reasons for our positive balance is our expenses are much lower than projected. We had an unfilled staff position for several months and we have under spent in the area of church maintenance and repair. History shows this will all even out in the course of the year.

The summer months are approaching which usually means lower attendance and lower giving. One way to keep your giving up-to-date if you will be gone over the summer is to use electronic giving. Just go to the Trinity website and you can set this up. Thanks for giving this a look!
